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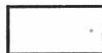
General Instructions

- Use 1/4" seam allowances throughout, unless directed otherwise.
- Sew with 12 stitches per inch (2.0).
- Always sew with right sides together (RST).
- Make sure your pieces are positioned so the finished units look **exactly** as shown in the sketches.
- Chain piece whenever possible to save time and improve precision.
- When doing your mystery with a group, and a line is forming at the ironing board, you may be able to go on to the next step without pressing the current one. I try to stagger them.

KEY: Those of you making a scrap version will use your darks where the pattern calls for main fabric, and your lights where the pattern uses background fabric. Scraps are used randomly.

Background Fabric

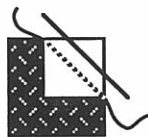
From the twenty-four 4 1/2" squares of main fabric and twenty-four 2 1/2" squares of background, make twenty-four units like the one at the right using a sew and flip technique. See below for more instruction on this technique. Press the seam allowances toward the small triangle.

Sew & Flip Technique

To make the units, place the small square of fabric, RST, in one corner of the large square. Stitch on the diagonal of the small square as shown in the sketch. This line can be drawn, if necessary for accuracy, or use The Angler®. Chain piece for speed and precision.



Trim both layers in the corner, as shown by the solid line, leaving 1/4" for seam allowance.

Repeat the above steps using the twenty-four 4 1/2" squares of background fabric and twenty-four 2 1/2" squares of main fabric to make twenty-four units like the one at the right. Press as before.
